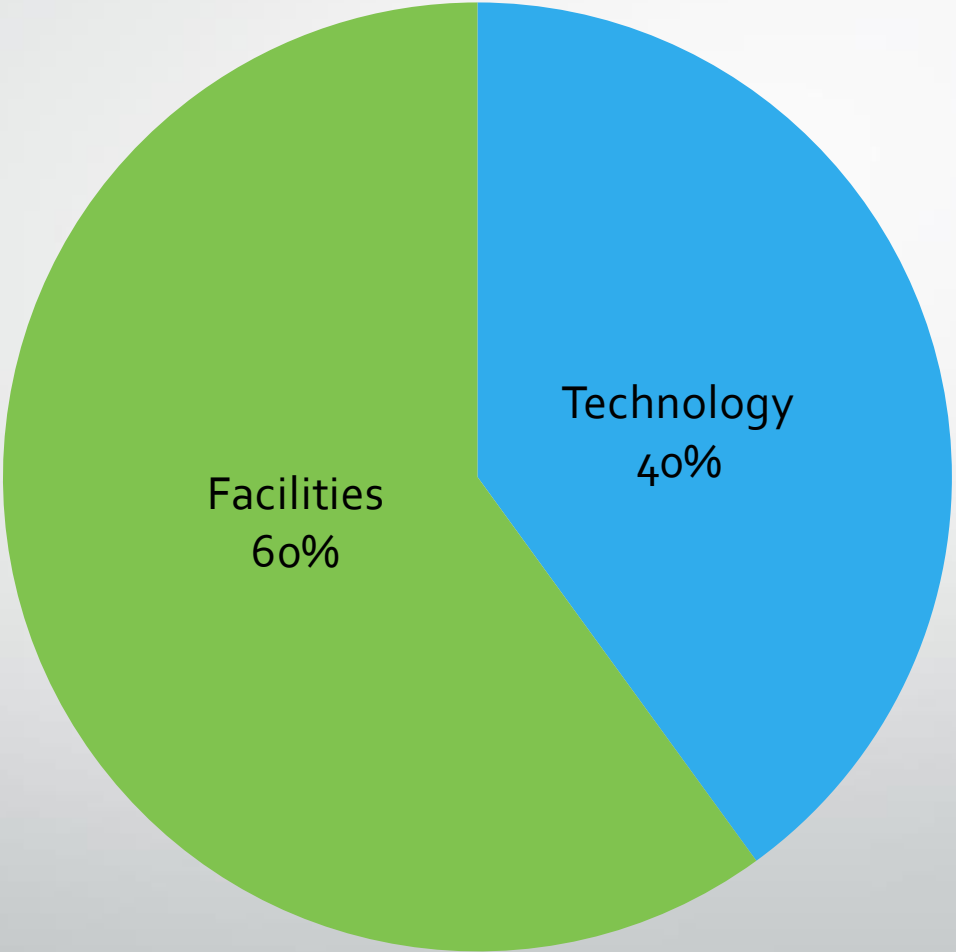

- Replacing and/or repairing roofs, windows, doors, plumbing and casework
- Replacing or repairing furnaces and boilers
- Repairing water damage and siding
- Brick tuck-pointing
- Resurfacing athletic track
- Improving signage
- Repairing parking and driveways

Capital Projects Levy

- Increasing Internet bandwidth
- Improving parent and student portal technology systems
- Increasing technology systems for safety and security
- Expanding networks and infrastructure capacity for wireless access
- Acquiring technology devices
- Installing, replacing, supporting and maintaining software and related training

 - Drive Reconfiguration - Highland Elementary
 - Main Entry Windows - High School

- 2016-17
 - Drive Reconfiguration - Valley View Elementary

 - Domestic Water Lines (phase 1 of 2) – High School

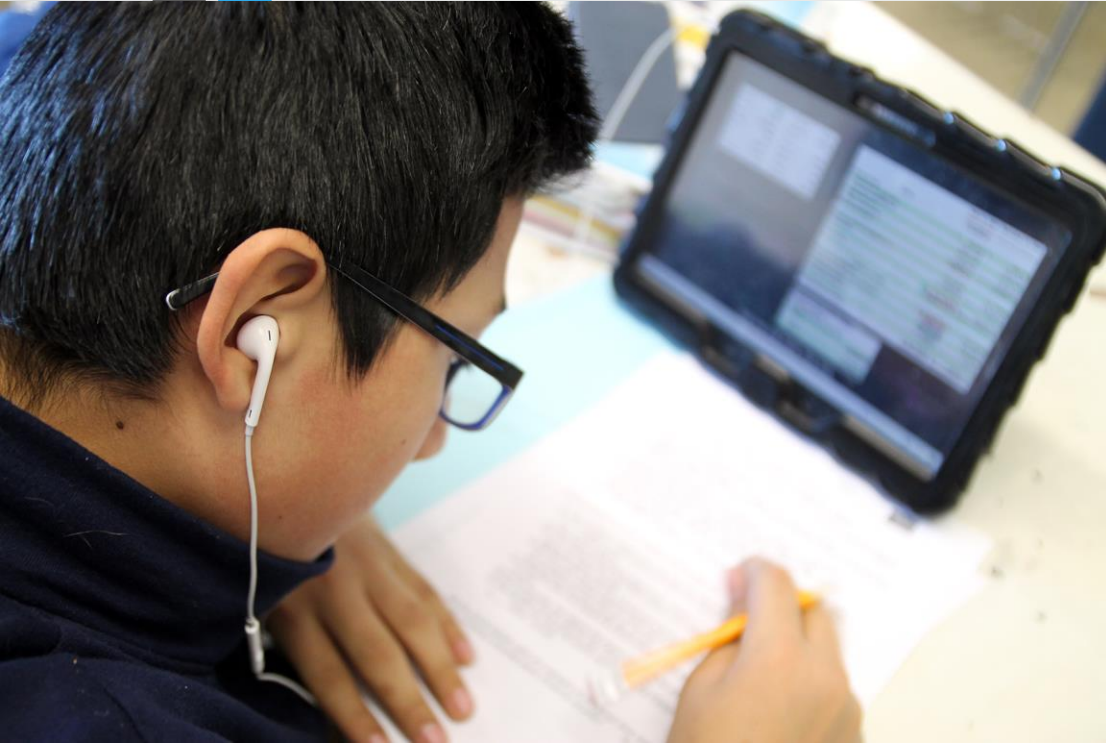


FY 2019 Facilities Capital Projects Levy

Personalized Learning

- History



- Focus of 40% of the levy dollars approved in 2014 was to expand and support Personalized Learning in CHPS
 - Endgame: 1-to-1 devices in grades **3-12**
- **2016-2017:** expanded to grades **4 and 9**
 - Technology Hardware (student devices and supporting infrastructure equipment)
 - Professional Development
- **2017-18:** expanded to Grades **4 and 11**
 - Added additional technology integration staff person to support the expansion of technology in instruction
 - Technology Hardware (student devices, supporting infrastructure equipment, and classroom technology)
 - Professional Development

Personalized Learning



- **2018-19**

- Continue technology integration staff person to support the expansion of technology in instruction
- Continue professional development programming
- Expanding 1-to-1 Chromebooks to now include grades **4-12**
- Technology Hardware (supporting infrastructure equipment, and classroom technology)
