

YES votes and 36.49% NO votes




CHPS Capital Project Levy Referendum Passed with 72.98% YES votes and 27.02% NO votes

We are so grateful for the community support in passing our Operating Levy and Capital Project Levy. These ongoing funds will provide financial stability for our district going forward. Though there have been recent increases in state funding, districts have had to go to their local communities to keep up with financial obligations. School districts have experienced increased costs due to inflation and this will lessen our need to borrow (with interest) to cover costs.

The Operating Levy will be used to support students in Career and Tech Education, Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) which we provide in PreK 4 through Grade 12; for continued arts and music programming as well as strong core academic subjects, such as reading and math. The Capital Project Levy funding provides support for deferred maintenance projects; safety and security improvements; tuckpointing; repair and replacement of casework; plumbing repair and replacement; parking and driveway improvements; repair of water damage and siding repair and replacement; and mechanical and signage improvements; and acquisition, installation, replacement, support and maintenance of software, improved technology, technology systems, network and infrastructure, and related training.



Israelson Featured in National Journalism Publication

Columbia Heights High School Senior, Jack Israelson, wrote a piece for the CHHS student school newspaper, The Heights Herald, which ended up being published on "Best of SNO". SNO is School Newspapers Online, which is the largest student journalism publication service in the country. Israelson's feature story is titled "The Need for Bike- and Pedestrian-Friendly Development in Columbia Heights Persists". The story focuses on the lack of and need for bike paths/trails in the City of Columbia Heights. Columbia Academy AVID Student Accepted into the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Youth Scholars Program

Columbia Academy 8th grader, Kieran Carruthers, was selected for the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Young Scholars Program. All 7th grade students participating in the AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) Program applied to the Cooke Young Scholars Program, but only 43 students nation-wide were selected.

The Cooke Foundation partners with AVID, which is a system that directly teaches students strategies to engage in high levels of thinking. AVID's mission is to close the achievement gap and to prepare all students for success in a global society. The foundation partners with AVID to help identify and support qualified applicants for the Young Scholars Program. The Cooke Foundation's Website states that "The Cooke Young Scholars Program is a selective five-year, pre-college scholarship for high-performing 7th grade students with financial need. It provides comprehensive academic and college advising, as well as financial support for school, Cooke-sponsored summer programs, internships, and other learning enrichment opportunities."



On top of still being an active AVID student at CHPS, Kieran will work with educational advisors through the Cooke Young Scholars Program to help with planning and goal-setting; funding for academic and extracurricular opportunities, such as music and art lessons, academic classes and technology; annual summer programs, including two required Cooke Young Scholars events; and year-round interaction and networking with a community of high achieving peers.

What is the purpose of Early Childhood Screening?

To promote healthy development, to identify children who may need further evaluation and to connect families to resources in the community.
